WATAUGA COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TUESDAY, JANUARY 16, 2017

The Watauga County Board of Commissioners held a regular meeting, as scheduled, on Tuesday, January 16, 2018, at 5:30 P.M. in the Commissioners' Board Room of the Watauga County Administration Building, Boone, North Carolina.

Chairman Welch called the meeting to order at 5:33 P.M.

Commissioner Hodges opened with a prayer and Commissioner Turnbow led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Chairman Welch called for additions and/or corrections to the December 19, 2017, regular meeting and closed session minutes.

Vice-Chairman Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Turnbow, moved to approve the December 19, 2017, regular meeting minutes as presented.

Vice-Chairman Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Turnbow, moved to approve the December 19, 2017, closed session minutes as presented.

Vice-Chairman Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Turnbow, moved to approve the January 16, 2018, agenda as presented.

COOPERATIVE EXTENSION UPDATE

Mr. Jim Hamilton, Cooperative Extension, presented an update on activities of the Watauga County Cooperative Extension. Mr. Hamilton stated that the staff of six was going strong. Christmas tree sales were up. The report was for information only; therefore no action was required.

PROPOSED APPLICATION FOR THE 2018 COMMUNITY WASTE REDUCTION AND RECYCLING GRANT

Ms. Pamela Thomas, Recycling Coordinator, presented a proposed grant application from the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality and Customer Service which is due on February 16, 2018. If awarded, funds would assist in the purchase of two (2) closed top roll-off containers to collect recycling materials at County schools. Ms. Thomas also reported that she is in communication with Mr. Danny Clark at the school system to work toward having a recycle bin in each classroom. The grant is for \$15,000 with a local match of \$3,000 of which the Watauga County School System has agreed to pay from funds allocated in their 2018-2019 budget. Ms. Thomas reported that between February 2017 and January 2018, 15,900 pounds of paper, 1,280 pounds of aluminum, and 2,160 pounds of plastic were collected for recycle from the containers located at the schools.

Vice-Chairman Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Hodges, moved to authorize the submission of the application for a grant from the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality and Customer Service in the amount of \$15,000 with the \$3,000 match to be paid by the Watauga County School System.

PROPOSED INCREASE TO FY 2018 HOME AND COMMUNITY CARE BLOCK GRANT (H&CCBG) FUNDS FOR PROJECT ON AGING

Ms. Angie Boitnotte, Project on Aging Director, requested acceptance of an increase in the FY 2018 Home and Community Care Block Grant (H&CCBG) funds in the amount of \$10,323. Ms. Boitnotte stated that the required local match is \$1,147 and is present in the Project on Aging's current FY 2018 budget.

Vice-Chairman Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Turnbow, moved to accept the \$10,323 increase in Community Care Block Grant (H&CCBG) funds for FY 2018 with a local match of \$1,147.

PROPOSED EXEMPTION OF "REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS" (RFQ) FOR GUY FORD ROAD ACCESS PROJECT

Mr. Joe Furman, Planning and Inspections Director, stated that N. C. General Statute 143-64.32 allows the County to exempt a project from N. C. General Statute 143-64.31 if the project cost is under \$50,000. Therefore, Mr. Furman requested the Board exempt the Guy Ford Road river access from N.C. General Statute 143-64.31.

Municipal Engineering has already conducted the preliminary design and cost estimates for Blue Ridge Conservancy. The County has now assumed the lead role with the acceptance of grant funds for this project. Due to Municipal Engineering's working knowledge of the project staff recommended the Board exempt this project from N.C. General Statute 143-64.31 and select Municipal Engineering for the final design, bidding, and construction administration as they would be most qualified for the project. Costs are expected to be well below the \$50,000 threshold.

Commissioner Turnbow, seconded by Vice-Chairman Kennedy, moved to exempt the Guy Ford Road Access project from N.C. General Statute 143-64.31 and select Municipal Engineering for the final design, bidding, and construction administration of the project.

COMMUNICATIONS AND EMERGENCY SERVICES MATTERS

A. Proposed Tier II Grant Award and Application

Mr. Jeff Virginia, Emergency Services Director, requested the acceptance of the Tier II grant in the amount of \$1,000 for 2017 and authorization to apply for the 2018 Tier II grant in the amount of \$1,000. The grant funds are used for hazardous materials emergency response planning, training and related exercises. The grant requires no match from the County.

Commissioner Turnbow, seconded by Vice-Chairman Kennedy, moved to accept the 2017 Tier II grant in the amount of \$1,000 and to authorize staff to submit the 2018 Tier II grant application.

B. Proposed Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG)

Mr. Jeff Virginia stated that, each year, the North Carolina Department of Public Safety provides grant monies for Counties completing certain emergency planning activities. These activities serve as the base amount and in the case of Watauga County amounts to \$20,625. The optional components for additional funding have not been determined as of yet. This is a yearly program in which the County has participated for over thirty (30) years.

Vice-Chairman Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Turnbow, moved to authorize the submission of the grant application to the North Carolina Department of Public Safety and complete the required activities to receive, at minimum, the \$20,625.

C. Presentation of the High Country Region Hazard Mitigation Plan Update and Proposed Resolution of Approval

Fire Marshal Taylor Marsh presented the High Country Region Mitigation Plan. Mr. Marsh stated that FEMA requires the plan to be updated every five (5) years. In the past, the plan only covered Watauga County and its municipalities. However, a grant for a regional mitigation plan for Watauga, Ashe, Alleghany, and Wilkes was received. The plan is required to be adopted in order for the County to receive reimbursements from FEMA in the event a disaster is declared in

the County. Mr. Marsh stated that the plan has been adopted by all of the Watauga County municipalities, North Carolina Emergency Management, and FEMA. A proposed resolution was presented approving the adoption of the Plan.

Vice-Chairman Kennedy, seconded by Commissioner Hodges, moved to adopt the High Country Region Mitigation Plan and adopt the resolution as presented.

MISCELLANEOUS ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

A. Proposed Offer to Purchase and Contract for Brookshire Road Property

County Manager Geouque stated that, at a previous meeting, the Board directed the County Manager to contact the potential buyer of the property located on Brookshire Road and give thirty days for an offer to be submitted. The County Manager presented an offer of \$50,000 which has since been submitted for the property. The due diligence period would end March 30, 2018. The property to be purchased includes approximately 14.5 acres of a 32.62 acre parcel and the entire 2 acres of an adjacent County owned parcel. The 32.62 acre parcel has a total tax value of \$1,602,200. This value includes the soccer complex facility valued at \$378,900. The 2 acre parcel is valued at \$45,000. The County Manager sought direction regarding acceptance of the offer or continuing to work with the Watauga Community Housing Trust's plan to develop the property for workforce housing.

This item was tabled until after closed session to allow for legal counsel by the County Attorney.

B. Proposed Dates for Annual Pre-Budget Retreat

County Manager Geouque stated that proposed dates for the Annual Pre-Budget Retreat are February 22 and 23, with times proposed as 12:00–7:00 P.M. on Thursday and 9:00 A.M.—1:00 P.M. on Friday. Two days are required for the Retreat and should the Board wish, times and dates may be adjusted accordingly.

By consensus, the Board agreed to tentatively set the dates for the Annual Pre-Budget Retreat for February 22 and 23, 2018, with direction to the County Manager to check with Commissioners' calendars.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION'S RECOMMENDATION ON APPALACHIAN THEATRE'S REQUEST FOR FUNDS

MANAGER'S COMMENTS:

RE: EDC recommendation on Appalachian Theatre

On January 11, 2018, the Economic Development Commission voted to recommend that the Board of Commissioners provide a one-time allocation of \$25,000 to the Appalachian Theatre. This was in response to the Theatre's request to the County for \$100,000 a year for 10 years, and upon the Commissioners' request for an EDC recommendation. The bases for the recommendation are 1) the Theatre recently announced a scaled-back development plan and that there are adequate funds on-hand or pledged to complete the plan, and 2) the ability by local governments to make such multi-year funding commitments is very limited. The EDC considers the theatre project to be viable and likely to contribute to the County's economic development and is amenable to consider additional funding requests under the following circumstances.

- 1. In light of the 2 reasons listed above, an updated funding request is in order;
- 2. Since an allocation of tax dollars was requested, the EDC believes it was appropriate to ask some questions, not all of which were answered to their satisfaction. The questions are:
 - What are the planned and projected uses of the community room?
 - Is phasing of the project possible, and if so, could the community room be opened first in order to generate revenue?
 - What is the plan for parking?
 - The Economic Impact Analysis projects the creation of 53 jobs, 42 of them direct, but does not provide detail such as what they are and if they are full-time. Is it possible to provide more detail?

A. Resolution Ordering The Referendum For A Quarter-Cent Local Option Sales Tax With The Proceeds To Be Utilized For A 2 Cent Property Tax Rate Reduction In Watauga County

MANAGER'S COMMENTS:

At the annual budget retreat the Board discussed conducting a special referendum for a quarter-cent local option sales tax. In the event that the quarter-cent local option sales tax is successful the proceeds would be used to reduce the current property tax rate of \$0.353 by 2 cents for new rate of \$0.333. Should the Board wish to conduct a special referendum for the quarter-cent local option sales tax the included resolution would need to be adopted so that the Board of Elections could place the item on the ballot.

If the voters pass the referendum and the Board of Commissioners wishes to levy the tax, it must provide 10 days public notice of its intent to adopt a resolution to levy the tax. After it adopts the resolution, it must send a certified copy of the resolution along with a certified copy of the election results of the referendum to the Department of Revenue.

The earliest the sales tax may become effective is on the first day of any calendar quarter so long as the county gives the Secretary of Revenue at least 90 days' advance notice. For example, if a referendum is held in May during the general election and passes, the earliest a county could begin collecting the revenue would be October.

Staff seeks direction for the Board.



RESOLUTION ORDERING THE REFERENDUM FOR A QUARTER-CENT LOCAL OPTION SALES TAX WITH THE PROCEEDS TO BE UTILIZED FOR A 2 CENT PROPERTY TAX RATE REDUCTION IN WATAUGA COUNTY

WHEREAS, Article 46, Subchapter 8, Chapter 105 of the North Carolina General Statutes (§105-535 through 538) provides counties with the authority to levy a local sales and use tax at a rate of one-quarter percent (0.25%); and

WHEREAS, the Watauga County property tax rate is currently \$0.353 and is the third lowest in the State of North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the Watauga County Board of Commissioners discussed levying a local sales and use tax at a rate of one-quarter percent (0.25%) at their Annual Budget Retreat in 2017; and

WHEREAS, the proceeds from the additional one-quarter percent (0.25%) local sales and use tax would be used to reduce the property tax rate from \$0.353 to \$0.333.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, pursuant to North Carolina General Statute 105-537, that the Watauga County Board of Commissioners hereby requests that the Watauga County Board of Elections conduct a special election advisory referendum on the <u>17th</u> day of <u>May</u>, <u>2018</u>, for all of Watauga County with the following ballot question:

"[]FOR []AGAINST

Local sales and use tax at the rate of one-quarter percent (0.25%) in addition to all other State and local sales and use taxes."

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the Watauga County Board of Commissioners requests that, at such time the special election voting data is tabulated and certified, the Board of Elections forward said advisory referendum results to the Board of Commissioners in order to proceed as allowed in the above referenced statutes in Chapter 105 of the North Carolina General Statutes; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the proceeds generated from this additional one-quarter percent (0.25%) sales tax shall be utilized to reduce the current property tax rate of \$0.353 by 2 cents and establishing the new property tax rate for Watauga County at \$0.333.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS:

<u>AppalCART</u>

The Town of Boone recommends the appointment of Ms. Connie Ulmer and Mr. Marshall Ashcraft as Town representative on AppalCART's Board. These are first readings and, therefore, no action is required.

Watauga County Board of Adjustment

The terms of Bill Ragan, Baxter Palmer and Todd Rice expired in November. All three are willing to continue to serve if reappointed. NC Statutes require a representative (resident) of each zoned area in counties that have partial-county zoning such as Watauga. Mr. Rice represents the Valle Crucis Historic District, which is a small area with limited population, therefore small pool of potential representatives. Mr. Palmer is the alternate member and is the representative of the Foscoe-Grandfather zoned area. Mr. Ragan resides in the Howard Creek Watershed, which is not a zoned area in the traditional sense, but since the watershed ordinance was adopted under zoning authority, the County has attempted to appoint residents of those areas when possible.

The Pond Creek (Beech Mountain) Watershed Ordinance was not adopted under zoning authority as it is not large enough to qualify for partial-county zoning. Adam Rhyne resides in the South Fork New River/Winkler Creek/Middle Fork watershed (the boundaries adjoin and form one larger watershed-regulated area). David Hill and Charles Phillips are at-large members. Those 3 terms are not expiring this year. The new South Fork New River Watershed for the new Boone water intake does not have a representative.

Volunteer applications have been received from Mr. John Prickett, Mr. Joe Quinn, and Mr. Michael Moore. All three have requested to serve on the Board of Adjustment.

Upon review, Mr. Moore's application indicates he lives in the Foscoe-Grandfather Community. He does not live within the zoned area or the community council designated area. These are first readings and, therefore, no action is required.

Economic Development Commission

Mr. Robert Hoffman recently resigned from the Economic Development Commission (EDC) due to relocation. His term expires in June 2020. A volunteer application has been received from Mr. Wallace Greer who has requested to serve on the EDC. If appointed, he would fill the unexpired term which ends on June 30, 2020. This is a first reading and, therefore, no action is required.

Watauga County Nursing Home Community Advisory Committee

Mr. Fred Badders' term will expire January 20, 2018, on the Watauga County Nursing Home Community Advisory Committee. He is willing to continue to serve an additional three-year term if reappointed. This is a first reading and, therefore, no action is required.

<u>Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committee</u>

Mr. Harold Eller's term will expire March 3, 2018, on the Watauga County Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committee. He is willing to continue to serve an additional three-year term if reappointed. This is a first reading and, therefore, no action is required.

Tourism Development Authority (TDA)

The terms of Mr. Jim Neustadt and Mr. Brad Moretz will expire February 28, 2018. The two seats must be occupied by someone representing a business that collects the occupancy tax in Watauga County. Mr. Wright Tilley, Watauga County TDA Director, has stated that both are willing to continue to serve an additional three-year term if reappointed. This is a first reading and, therefore, no action is required.

WAMY Community Action

Ms. Joy Coffey's final term as a Public Sector representative for Watauga County ends on February 8, 2018. Ms. Melissa Soto, Executive Director of WAMY, requests a Commissioner or appointee be appointed to fill the four-year term. This is a first reading and, therefore, no action is required.
